## Hi Mr Ambrose

I have tried to speak to you this morning at 10am on the Monday 08<sup>th</sup> April 2013 as you requested I telephone you at that time (for me to have a conversation with Mr Gohlan) during our previous conversation. On doing so, I was told that you are on annual leave and that you had taken three days off and would not be available until Thursday.
